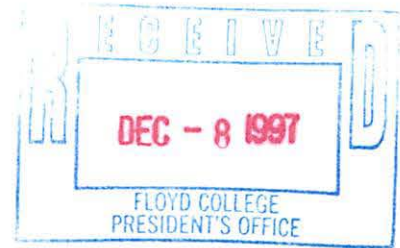

RE: December Board Meeting

As you may recall, when we embarked on the historic and marathon capital process, it was pointed out that it would be a dynamic process. In part this was because we postponed considering off-campus sites pending the adoption of policy and decision rules. Since those have now been adopted, we are ready to consider four proposals: Coastal Georgia Community College for Camden Center; Floyd College for Bartow County; Georgia State University for North Metro Center; and DeKalb College/University of Georgia for Gwinnett County. Coastal Georgia's Camden Center and Floyd College's Bartow Center are replacements for current projects on the priority list. Georgia State University's North Metro Center does not require a capital priority list project as it will be locally bond funded. The DeKalb/University of Georgia's Gwinnett Center will be added as priority #14 on the capital outlay list.

Additionally, we will also be considering modifications to projects at Georgia Southern University and Macon State College; neither of these modifications will change the priority order.

Attached you will find materials which have gone to the Board of Regents. I urge you to read them, particularly those presidents with proposals and other presidents who may have interest in these regions. Please contact Senior Vice Chancellor Desrochers or me if you have any questions.
