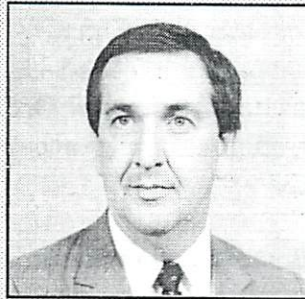

Floyd Receives Child Care Grant

Floyd College has received a \$30,000 grant from the Georgia Child Care Council to enhance quality child care services in the Floyd County area.

The money will be used for a multi-faceted program which includes consumer education directed toward helping Floyd College students make informed choices in selection of child care services; a training program for

service providers including workshops in curriculum, administration and family services; and scholarship offerings for career child care employees to pursue degrees in areas directly related to child care services and education.

The program will be implemented by *Adrian Bowers*, associate professor and *Carolyn Parks*, assistant professor, Child Development.
