Walraven, Maddox Honored

Dr. Wesley Walraven, vice president, and Judge J.D. Maddox were honored Saturday during graduation ceremonies with two new awards. Dr. Walraven received the Faculty Meritorius Award and Judge Maddox received the President's Meritorious Award.

President Lynn Cundiff established the awards to honor a faculty member and a member of the community each year. The faculty member to be honored is selected by a campus committee. The community award recipient is selected by the President.

Dr. Walraven will retire from Floyd College June 30 after 23 years of service. He came to the college before it was opened to students and played a large part in setting the focus and mission of the college. The faculty award will hereafter be called the Wesley Walraven Faculty Award.

Judge Maddox was very instrumental in the establishment of Floyd College in Rome, pushing through a referendum for the community to financially support the building of the campus. He is also a former member of the Board of Regents. *ES*
