



## Foundation Campaign

The Floyd College Foundation Board of Trustees kicked-off the 1994 Pacesetter Campaign at a general meeting held at Zartic, Inc. on April 19. **Chairman Mary Louise Lever** announced that a total of \$6,800 had been raised for scholarship and for general use and another \$45,000 had been donated towards a computer laboratory for the college's East Rome Campus, Heritage Hall.

Foundation members will be calling on past donors to ask them to pledge their support again this year. Floyd College employees will be getting a letter with their paychecks in the next few weeks. Monies raised through the 1994 Pacesetter Campaign will go towards scholarships and supporting faculty and staff projects. Last year, the foundation awarded almost \$30,000 in scholarships and more than \$15,000 in faculty and staff projects. Some of the projects funded include:

- ♦ Supporting the Visual Impulse Performers (VIPs) by providing musical accompaniment, costumes, props and press package
- ♦ Funding faculty and staff development through the Human Resources department
- ♦ Underwriting a luncheon for area high school counselors
- ♦ Sponsoring the annual employee appreciation dinner
- ♦ Matching funds for nursing students to attend conferences
- ♦ Underwriting the annual Advisory Committee Luncheon for Nursing
- ♦ Supporting the annual Senior Visitation Day

This year the Foundation will dedicate funds for the transformation of the gymnasium at Heritage Hall to a facility for college and community use. Tentatively named "Center Stage," the room will feature a full-sized stage with professional lighting and sound with a carpeted floor and moveable chairs and tables. The walls will be used as exhibit space for local artists. A committee of trustees and members of the community will be meeting to determine the best use of the space and to develop guidelines for the renovation.

Meanwhile the Floyd College Foundation constructed the 12,000 square-foot building on an acre of land leased by the Board of Regents. The Foundation contracted with a consortium of local banks to finance the building which was completed in December.
