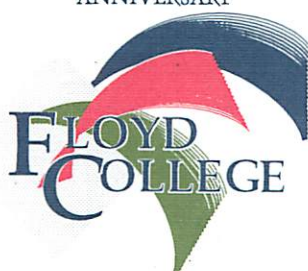

Regents Meeting Here

The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia will hold its November meeting at Floyd College, Wednesday and Thursday, November 9-10. The Regents, some of their spouses, Central Office Staff members and up to 50 guests are expected to be on campus for the visit.

The Regents will arrive Wednesday morning and tour the campus. Some of them will attend committee meetings before attending a luncheon in the newly renovated quiet dining room. The board meeting will begin at 1 p.m. During that time those spouses attending will tour and shop in Cave Spring. In the evening, a community-wide reception will be held at Heritage Hall from 6-7:15 p.m. All college employees and Foundation Board members are invited to attend with their spouse or guest.

On Thursday, the Regents will be treated to a breakfast at the Holiday Inn Skytop, hosted by the Greater Rome Chamber of Commerce. The board meeting will begin at the college at 9 a.m. The Regents will conclude their business by noon and will have a quick lunch here before departing.

This is the first time the Regents have held one of their monthly meetings at Floyd College. They hold their meetings on college campuses only twice a year.
