Floyd Sports Athletics this Weekend

In the inaugural Collegiate Sports Festival this weekend. Hosted by Floyd College, the festival will feature competition in team and individual sports for men and women at the non-varsity, intramural level. The festival is being directed by *Paul Kennedy*, a well-known and respected sports figure in the area.

Participating colleges include Floyd College, Dalton College, Darton College, Gainesville College, Northeast (AL) State College, North Metro Technical Institute, Oxford College, Bainbridge College and Young Harris College. The athletes will participate in basketball, softball, volleyball, bowling, golf, tennis and table tennis.

The athletes will begin arriving Thursday evening and will be treated to a deli dinner in the Student Center. *Elizabeth Hurt*, an employee of Randstad Staffing Services in Atlanta, who is responsible for the recruitment of 17,000 employees for the Olympics, will be the dinner speaker.

The festival will be played at various venues in the Rome-Floyd County area beginning Friday morning. The early rounds of the basketball tourney will be played at Rome High School and Armuchee High School with the championship rounds to be played at Floyd College. The softball tourney will be played at the new Alto Park complex. The volleyball tourney will be held at the Floyd College gymnasium. Bowling will be played at Classic Lanes, golf at the Stonebridge Golf Club, table tennis at Rome's Memorial Gym, and tennis at the Rome/Floyd Tennis Center. All competitions are open to the public and are free of charge.

Teams or individuals placing first, second or third in each competition will receive gold, silver, and bronze medallions immediately following each tournament.

David Mathis, laboratory coordinator in HPER, has directed the recruitment of players and coaches for Floyd College's teams. The cost of the tournament has been covered by sponsors and donors who were contacted by Mr. Kennedy.
